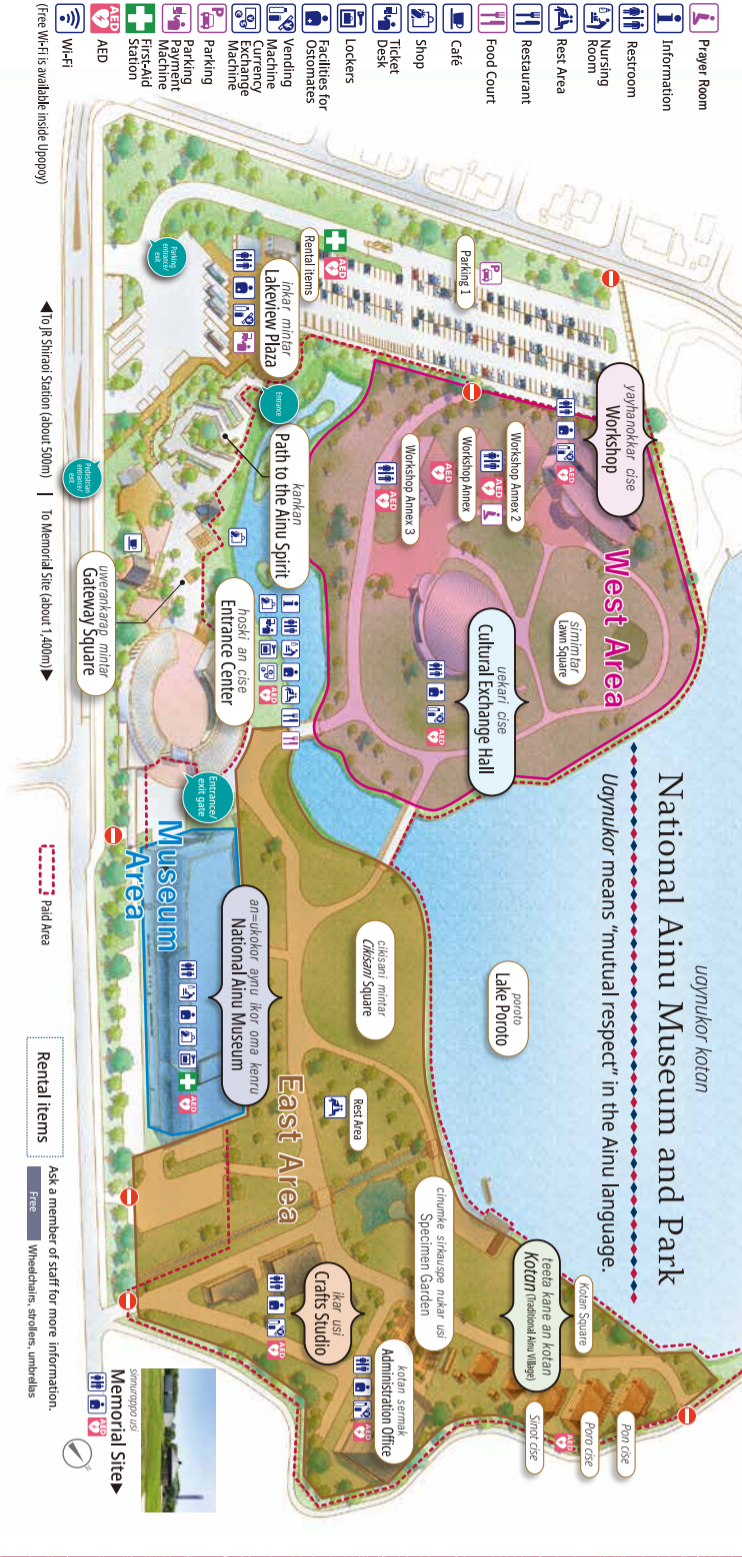
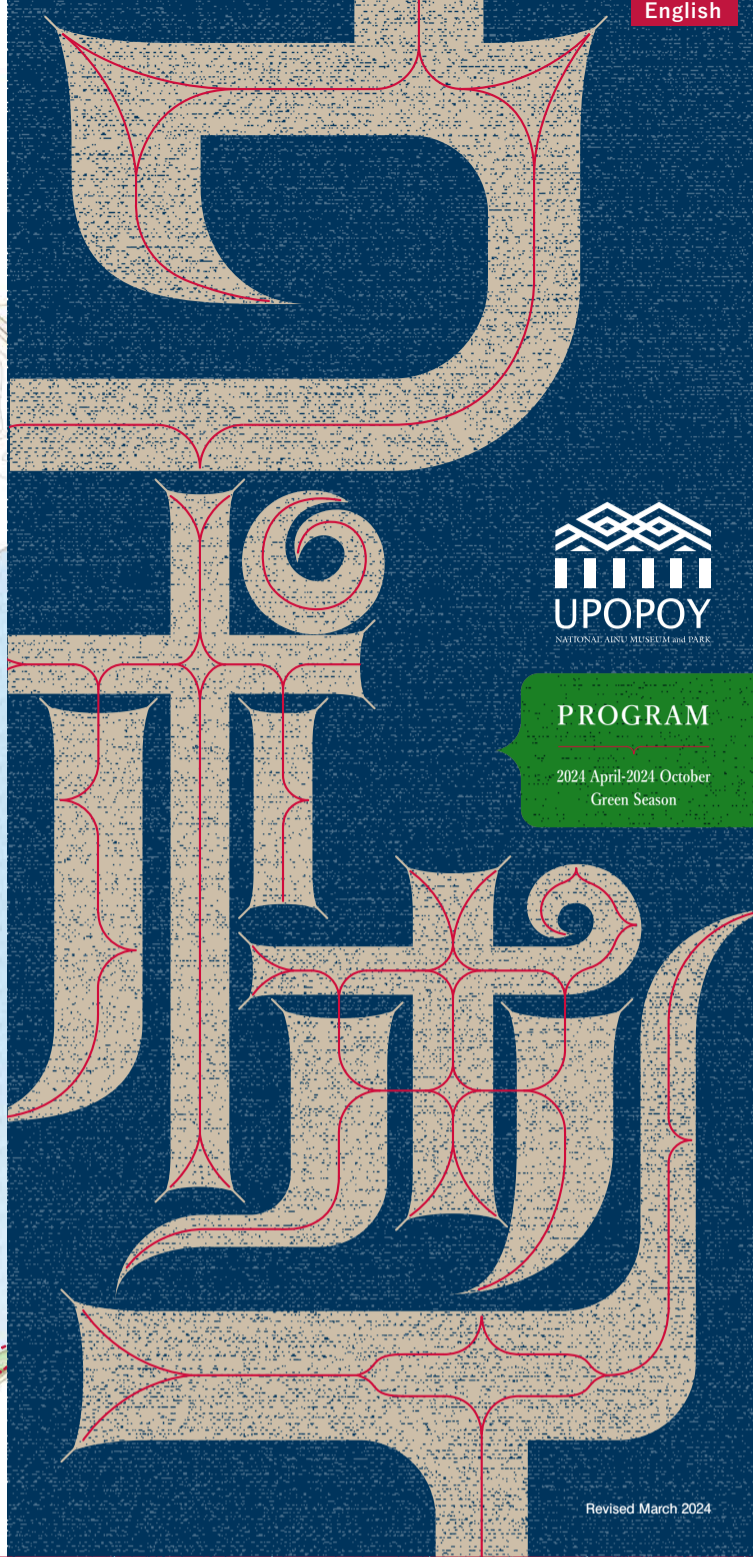

Length: Around 60 minutes

Length: Around 30 minutes
- teeta kane an kotan Kotan (Traditional Ainu Village)**
Length: Around 60 minutes

Try on Ainu clothing
You can try on Ainu clothing inside a cise (Ainu house). Through this experience, you can get a close look at Ainu embroidery.

Capacity: 6 adults and 6 children (in order of registration)

Cooking Workshop "Ponto Kitchen"
In this roughly 2-hour program, you will make and indulge in a hearty bowl of ohaw, a traditional Ainu soup packed with seasonal ingredients.
